BS 18001:2007 Occupational health and safety management systems. Requirements



BS 18001:2007 specifies requirements for an OH&S management system, to enable an organization to control its OH&S risks and improve its performance. It does not state specific OH&S performance criteria, nor does it give detailed specifications for the design of a management system, which can be found in BS 8800:2004. BS 18001 is based on OHSAS 18001.

The aim of this standard is to provide organizations with a framework for managing occupational health and safety in order to minimize the risk of workplace ill-health and injury. This standard addresses occupational health and safety rather than the safety of products and services.**
